Dear People of St. Luke's,



So I think that part of our collective vocation in this place is to take people, nurture them, benefit from their presence and gifts, and send them off again—enriched and better equipped to make a difference in whatever setting they find themselves.

We'll have an opportunity to thank Tom and Carlene November 11. After the service there will be a special coffee hour brunch. Their final Sunday will be November 18.

Meanwhile, by the time you get this Corey will have begun mentored practice at St. Mark's Waterville. This particular good-bye is temporary, and is made in order that (God willing, and things proceeding according to plan) we can say hello in a fuller way as she steps into a new role in June.

# FAEM Carol Sing at Old South & Northfield Concert at St. Luke's


Please attend our Ecumenical Carol Sing at Old South on Sunday, December 2 at 3pm.

I want to focus a minute on Grace Place, because the last newsletter featured its start up. Since that time we have welcomed several kids from the community, as well as some of our own. We've fed them healthy snacks, told stories from the gospels, begun each session with a "welcome rap," to the rhythm of "roses are red, violets are blue" (they love it), and generally tried to fill each time slot with activities and crafts. It has been a lot of work, and many of you have helped out. I believe it is making a difference in the lives of these children and their families. The purpose of Grace Place is to "feed children with God's love through Bible stories and healthy snacks." I'm not sure how you measure this sort of thing, but I am sure that feeding is taking place, on more than one level; and that includes those of us who are helping out.

## Parish Stewardship

As this edition of the newsletter goes out I want to talk about some of what we hope to do with our ongoing stewardship.

First, a gentle but very important reminder: if you can get caught up on a pledge we would very much appreciate it. I watch the treasurer decide which of the necessary bills he can pay. We made some significant cuts last year; we will likely make more this year. But we need your help. Thank you. Secondly, I am going to do a series of short, weekly pieces on "Proportionate Giving as Spiritual Practice."

These will probably take place just before the offertory. The overall theme of this series is that sharing our resources is an integral part of our faith journey, and that it can be liberating not onerous. (No, I'm not pretending "whitewashing this fence" is really fun.)

Next, beginning in Advent we will be highlighting some ministries which take place. Stewardship doesn't mean "how we raise money in the fall," but "all the ways we respond to God 's call," and offering our time and talent is a big piece of that.

The vestry and I will also be looking at a couple of other directions. But what I have described above will be taking place, and we will gather up our pledge cards on November 25, the feast of Christ the King, the last Sunday before the new church year begins in Advent.



### PASTORAL CARE MINISTRY

In the near future I'll be sending out a letter as part of the process of updating our pastoral care ministry. This ministry has been going on informally a long time, and more formally for the past two or three years. As with all things, it needs some tweaking; "it ain't broke," so we aren't fixing it. We are trying to be more current in our assessment of both needs and people who might help address a particular kind of need. As the stewardship article pointed out, use of our gifts is an integral part of being a good steward. I hope to involve a good number of people without overburdening anybody. Stay tuned!


# Winter & Warm Hearts

for wrapping items since they are most popular.


Bags are the fastest & easiest way for young people to wrap gifts for everyone on their list!
